BATAVIA TOWNSHIP GOLD STAR HONOR ROLL

The following are honored on the occasion of the Batavia Memorial Homecoming sponsored by the citizens of Batavia Township and the City of Batavia. All have given their lives in the service of their country during World War II and a medal commemorating their services to their country is being presented to their loved ones by the City of Batavia as a mark of respect and appreciation for the service they gave to their country in its time of need.

- FRANCIS ALBEROVSKY—U. S. Navy (USS Arizona, 12-7-41) Batavia's first war casualty.
- ARNOLD ANDERSON—U. S. Army. Killed at Eggenroth, Germany on April 22, 1945.
- DONALD ANDERSON—U. S. Coast Guard. Mooseheart graduate. Entered service in December 1941. Reported missing on October 5, 1942. Crew member of the U. S. Coast Guard Cutter Muskeget.
- ROBERT D. ANDERSON—Army Air Corps. Killed on April 12, 1945. Completing mission 100 miles north of Tokyo. Killed on return over Guam.
- ARDEN BODEEN—U. S. Army. Killed near Metz, France on November 19, 1944.
- RICHARD JACK BRILL—U. S. Navy. On USS Houston when it was sunk in the South West Pacific on February 28, 1942.
- JOHN C. BURCH—Army Air Corps. Mooseheart graduate. Entered service November 27, 1943. Killed on November 2, 1944, European Theatre.
- GEORGE CARR—U. S. Army. Killed on Leyte Island October 25, 1943.
- CARL E. CHRISTENSEN, JR.—U. S. Army. Killed in action in France, November 29, 1944.
- CLARE B. CONDE—U. S. Army. Killed in the European front on December 28, 1944. He was a Major with the 46th U. S. Field Artillery.
- ADOLPH LEROY ERICKSON—Army Air Corps. Killed shortly after leaving for overseas on a mission in a Flying Fortress. Died in England on December 31, 1943.
- DENNIS ARTHUR EDWARDS—U. S. Army. Killed in Germany on November 26, 1944.
- EVERETT HOLM—U. S. Army Paratrooper. Killed July 11, 1943, while participating in airborne phase of invasion of Sicily. Death recorded as of July 12, 1944.
- WALTER H. JOHNSON—U. S. Army. Killed on December 15, 1944 in France.
- CHARLES "ROSS" MARTIN—U. S. Army. Killed on October 17, 1945 in Germany. Death result of a traffic accident at the railroad siding of Goppingen, Germany, where he was picking up other soldiers.
- GERALD NELSON—One of the first casualties. (No other information).
- LEO EDWARD SENNETT—U. S. Army Paratrooper. Died of infantile paralysis on Leyte Island on December 26, 1944.
- JEROME J. PALECEK—U.S.N.R. Killed on take off at Richmond, Va., April 3, 1943.
- ROBERT PYE—Died in the typhoon which occurred after V-J Day. Do not know exact date.
- NORBERT SCHMITZ—Army Air Corps. Mooseheart graduate. Entered service August 7, 1943. Died in Germany on April 1, 1945.
- HOMER SHERMAN—Army Air Corps. Died in a plane crash in England on October 23, 1943.
- ROBERT SHERMAN—Army Air Corps. Entered service the day after Pearl Harbor. Reported missing in flight in the China-India Theatre. Received word of death in December, 1944.
- DONALD SHERMAN—Army Air Corps. Shot down over Schweinfurt, taken prisoner and marched from Kerms, Austria into mountains (march started on April 8, 1945). Donald was shot and killed on the third day of this march by his Nazi Guard. He had been missing since October 14, 1943.
- EVERETT G. STENMAN—Army Air Corps. Reported missing February 10, 1945, when his plane failed to return to its base after a mission to Nakajima Aircraft Factory at Ota. Stationed on Mariana Islands.
- PENDRAL STENMAN—U. S. Navy. Died on December 12, 1941.
- KENNETH SWANSON—Army Air Corps. Reported missing on mission to Tokyo. Stationed on Mariana Island. Same mission as Everett Stenman. Plane collided in mid-air with B-29 of same squadron. Date of February 11, set as date of death.
- LaVERNE O. WENBERG—U. S. Army. Killed August 22, 1944 in France.
- JOHN RAYMOND WISBROCK—Army Air Corps. Killed in airplane crash at Fresno, California, July 8, 1944. Would have graduated next month as a heavy bomber pilot.
- DONALD DELBERT WICKLUND—Army Air Corps. Missing in action since July 21, 1944. Failed to return from a bombing mission to Brux, Czechoslovakia. Declared a casualty as of July 22, 1945.

LINE OF MARCH

The parade will form in East Wilson Street, east of Prairie St.; Washington Avenue, Van Buren Street and Prairie Street, both north and south of Prairie. It will proceed west in Wilson Street to Batavia Avenue, south on Batavia Avenue to Main Street, west on Main Street to Washington Street, north on Washington Street to the Grace McWayne School where the small children will fall out and take positions on the parks and sidewalks. The parade following the children will proceed north on Washington Street to Illinois Avenue, west on Illinois Avenue to Harrison Street, south on Harrison Street to disband. At the intersection of Illinois Avenue and Jefferson Street the service men will take places on the sidewalks and parking to view the remainder of the parade as it passes by. The general public is asked to please leave the space along Washington Street in front of the school and on Illinois Avenue west from Jefferson vacant for the purpose indicated above.

The Memorial Field Dedication

An important feature of this eventful Homecoming Celebration is the dedication of the Batavia High School Memorial Athletic Field as a partial memorial to the youth of the City of Batavia and Batavia Township who served so gloriously in World War II. This Memorial typifies the spirit of youth. It is a Living Memorial. It will be used for the physical well-being of our children, youth, and ex-servicemen through the years to come.

The improved athletic field, when completed, will have:

1. A building with dressing rooms and showers.
2. A softball diamond.
3. A baseball diamond.
4. A quarter-mile track with a 220 yard straightaway.
5. Portable bleachers.
6. Lighting for softball games, tennis, football, and community events.
7. Parking facilities.

This is a community project. Into it has been poured the financial gifts and the physical labor of a host of people who are proud to share in creating this Living Memorial.

In loving memory of those who made the supreme sacrifice in World War II, and in sincere gratitude to those who were spared to return to us, this field is dedicated as a partial Memorial by a grateful community, as the Batavia High School Memorial Athletic Field.
